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Try these activities with your preschooler!



Use new words with your child and encourage your child to use them too:

- bloom- to change or grow
- variety-all different kinds
- spring-one of the four seasons, when the weather becomes warm

Ask open-ended questions like:

- What are some things you like about springtime?
- How do you know it's springtime?



Read books or tell stories about springtime.

Go on an outdoor scavenger hunt together.
What do you notice? Draw pictures of insects, birds, and plants you observe and support your child to label, or words next to the drawings.
Find puddles and see what floats or sinks.
