Working with Infants, Toddlers, Preschool & Pre-K Children Training Plan

The training plan outlined below is ideal for nonprofit staff and volunteers who are working with young children, ages 0-5. In an effort to provide meaningful training that is feasible for staff and volunteers to complete, our team of early learning experts have selected three recommended science-based courses, totaling 6 hours of training.
